RIGHTS RESPECTING



Article 12: Children have a right to say what they think should happen when decisions are being made that affect them – that is, children's voices should be heard.

Article 13: Children have the right to get and share information.

Article 29: Education should include the development of respect for the natural environment.

Road Safety - The Car Park: We have made a considerable effort to ensure that our car parks are safe for our children and families and will continue to do so.

Despite our efforts, there are still a number of parents/carers who are not following our advice. This creates delays in the car park, increases the likelihood of confrontation with other people (which we do not want) and puts our children at higher risk of injury.

Please find attached a letter from Cranbrook Safer Neighbourhood Team - who have been supporting us in keeping our children safe in the car park.

Some may have noticed the presence of two members from Redbridge Council. This was to observe traffic compliance. We will continue to seek the local authority's help and advice in making our car parks safer.

It is with sadness and disgust that I have to report two incidents of abuse in two days. One directed at another parent and the other at a member of our staff. This behaviour of abuse **Must Stop**!

Further actions may be sought, should such behaviours continue.

Attendance: I continue to remain concerned about the poor attendance of many of our Reception pupils. Parents, please make every effort to improve this if your child's attendance is below 90%.

Late Arrivals In The Morning: Please ensure your child gets into school on time by 8.50am. The gates and doors leading to the classrooms through the main playground close at 9.00am.

SchoolPing: To help improve communication and save on costs, we have signed up to a service called SchoolPing, which is already used by hundreds of schools across the country to communicate with parents and carers. We will no longer be using Parentmail once SchoolPing is available.

This service is in the process of being set up for our school and will be launched in June after half term. More information will follow in the next couple of weeks.

School Website: I would encourage all Parents/ Carers to visit the school website regularly to read and note new updates and information. It is full of key information. By the end of this week, we will have the updated curriculum overviews up for you to know in advance what we will be focussing on for the next half-term.

<u>Medication Info for Year 6 Children on the residential trip in</u> June 2023:

Dear Parents/carers, for those children going on the residential trip this year, please ensure that medication is in school by Friday 10^{th} June. Please note that parents are required to complete a medical consent form for any medication that is handed in.

Children with asthma pumps already in school, do not need to provide anything else. However, if your child takes their brown pump, this must be in school before Friday 10th June at the latest.

Important: All medication must go to Meena, our First Aider, by Friday 10th June. Consent forms for any additional medication that is taken, including the brown asthma pumps, must also be handed in good time. Please also note certain medication can only be accepted if it has been prescribed by the GP. So it is important that you speak to Meena as soon as possible.

<u>Private Fostering Redbridge</u>: Private fostering is when someone who is not a close relative cares for another person's child under the age of 16 (18 if disabled) for 28 days or more.

A close relative is considered to be an aunt, uncle, grandparent, step parent or siblings. Friends of the family and other family members such as cousins or great aunts are not classed as close relatives for the purposes of Private Fostering, neither are families hosting overseas students who are being educated in the UK.

You need to legally notify us of any private fostering arrangements in Redbridge to ensure the child is safe.
