Children will receive special award time and attendance certificates for 100% attendance.




On this exciting path of learning we will be looking at the history of the first flight and various forms of transport used. We will provide opportunities to look at significant events and people from the past.

# PHONICS

- Letters and Sounds Contains games and activities we use to help children with phonics. Available online for FREE.
- Children are taught to read by breaking down words into separate sounds or 'phonemes'. They are then taught how to blend these sounds together to read the whole word.
- Children have a 20 minute daily phonics lesson every morning.
- Children will be assessed each half term using past phonics papers.


